## **Over The Precipice**

"Meet Lauren King, Preaching Intern at 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue Church of Christ," an online video, has prompted much discussion over the past month. King entered Lipscomb University as a communications major but quickly transferred to the Bible Department to study youth ministry, serving three internships in this field. When she determined to shift her emphasis to preaching, Lipscomb secured an internship for her under the direction of Patrick Mead, senior minister of the 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue church in Franklin, Tenn.

While there has been a growing use of women to preach by progressive congregations and institutions, the wide Internet circulation of the Lauren King video was a flashpoint, exposing a fundamental rift among churches of Christ.

### A Lesson from the Past

The *Gospel Advocate* maintains a policy of supporting unity in truth. We take no pleasure in division, but some members, with whom we have enjoyed fellowship, have gone where we cannot go.

The same sad reality faced David Lipscomb in the late 1800s. As an editor of this journal, he addressed many controversial topics – notably the use of instrumental music in worship and higher critical theories of biblical interpretation. Lipscomb attempted to maintain unity for decades, but he was eventually forced to recognize that division was inevitable.

In 1892, the Disciples of Christ held a convention in Nashville, Tenn. (apparently choosing Lipscomb's hometown as a personal affront). At this gathering, women were used prominently to preach.

For David Lipscomb, this marked the point of no return in dividing the church. As Robert Hooper records, "the total abandonment of the Bible to accept new positions for women in the church was theologically liberal to the core. This acceptance of a liberal position convinced him that he could no longer extend fellowship to the Christian church, a term that began to be used exclusively for the more progressive Disciples of Christ" (*A Distinct People* 34).

The underlying issue was biblical authority. Lipscomb could charitably consider the earlier controversies as questions of interpretation. Brushing aside the clear teachings of Scripture, his former brethren had embraced a different religion – in this way leaving the fellowship they had once shared.

#### The Same Fork in the Road

In our own day, changes in worship are highlighting a change that has already occurred in the hearts of men and women.

Worship defines a religion. Changes in worship are often the clear sign of a fundamental shift from one religion to another.

Male spiritual leadership is a pattern designed by God for the ordering of the church, especially in worship. The prohibition against women leading in public teaching is direct, as we read in I Timothy 2:11-14: "Let a women learn quietly with all submissiveness. I do not permit a woman to teach or to exercise authority over a man; rather, she is to remain quiet. For Adam was formed first, then Eve; and Adam was not deceived, but the woman was deceived and became a transgressor" (ESV).

The apostle Paul is clear. Women are not "to teach or to exercise authority over a man." They are not to do so because of the order in which God created Adam and Eve and because of how Adam and Eve fell into sin. Rooting these prohibitions in the truth of Creation, Paul shows they are valid for Christians in all places and all times. As long as human beings are descendants of Adam and Eve, the principal of male spiritual leadership is in place.

First Corinthians 14:34-35 makes the same point: "The women should keep silent in the churches. For they are not permitted to speak, but should be in submission, as the Law also says. If there is anything they desire to learn, let them ask their husbands at home. For it is shameful for a woman to speak in church."

In rejecting the clear teaching of Scripture, those supporting women leading in worship have abandoned the shared view of biblical authority that formerly served as the basis of our fellowship.

The prohibition against women speaking in worship in no way lessens the shared responsibility all Christians have to engage in the work of the church. Women are precious to God and are a vital part of the Lord's work. It is demeaning to suggest women are second rate if they do not assume the positions of leadership reserved for men.
