As Sally sat thinking about how angry she was because she did not have a chance to throw any darts at her target, Dr. Smith began removing the target from the wall.

Underneath the target was a picture of Jesus. A hush fell over the room as each student viewed the mangled picture of Jesus; holes and jagged marks covered His face and His eyes were pierced.

Dr. Smith dismissed the class with these words: "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me" (Matthew 25:40).

No other words were necessary. Tears filled the eyes of the students focused only on the picture of Christ.

There was a woman who was constantly going to the minister complaining that no one was visiting her or serving her in the church when she was in pain or need. Slowly the grateful shut-in, leading by example, influenced the other woman to see just how grateful she should actually be and that her pains or needs were minimal in comparison, and the woman worked on changing her attitude.

Mark 10:45 "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Let's look at John 13:1-17, for the ways in which Jesus loved and served others:

John 13:1 "Just before the Passover feast, Jesus knew that his time had come to depart from this world to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he now loved them to the very end."

Jesus loved and served these men:

- 1. Unconditionally He loved them to the end...
- 2. Sacrificially He knew that he was leaving, but was still thinking of his followers.
- 3. Demonstrably He put the towel around himself and washed their feet, ALL of their feet, knowing that Judas would betray him, that Peter would deny him, knowing everything.
- 4. No one was unworthy of His service. He included everyone, and loved them.
- 5. He loved them without the expectation of getting anything in return. Even knowing what was coming, he was still concerned about their welfare.

What is the acid test of a true servant? It's when you do something for someone else who is utterly incapable of EVER returning the favor.

Just some thoughts; we've all come across people who are bitter and concerned only with what they can "get." It's when you see those people who have very little to give, yet keep on giving, that it really makes you see how God is working in them.

Does Your Name Match?

In 2008, in the Romanian county where our family lived, a woman brought home what she thought was her newborn girl. When she changed the baby's diaper for the first time at home, she found that the hospital had given her a boy. The hospital explained that it was a mix up of the families' last names—Zahariuc and Zaharia. The woman was not suspicious because the baby was wearing the clothes that the parents provided. Romanian hospitals do not use foot and wrist bracelets that American hospitals use to match the names of newborns to their parents before discharging them. Nor do they allow the babies to stay in the room with their mothers, which explains why she did not dress her baby nor change the diaper until she got home. Thankfully, the parents were able to get their daughter home safely.

How does the world identify the true child of God? Does the name he or she wears match the name of Jesus. There are some identity bracelets that disciples do where that allow them to be identified. The first is the disciples' love for one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another. (John 13:34-35). This love shows concern for one another. Thus the admonition in 1 John: Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth (3:18). I've seen many examples of love for one another here at Hamburg Pike. Let me commend you to God for it.

Another identity bracelet of a true disciple is fruit. My father-in-law is able to identify many trees by their leaves. I can do that only with a few, but I can certainly identify fruit trees by the fruit they produce. Jesus said, *You will recognize them* (false prophets) by their fruits. Are grapes gathered from thornbushes, or figs from thistles? (Matthew 7:15-16). John 15:8 By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples. In the context, it is again, the fruit of love that they must have for one another.

Another identity bracelet that matches the name we claim with the name of the Lord is John 8:31 So Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, 32 and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." So many today are closing their ears to the voice of Jesus to listen to the voice of culture and are compromising with it. If we stay strong and true to the teachings of Jesus and continue in it, one will be free from the slavery of sin. One can be shackled by the hands of persecution. For example, Christians might eventually be fined or find themselves in a jail cell for speaking against homosexuality, but the heart cannot be shackled when it is free of sin. By standing up for Jesus, abiding in His word and never backing down, the world (the sinsphere) will indeed know that we are truly His disciples.
