Of course, we have all heard the old saying that resolutions are made in January and forgotten in March. This brings to mind another old, but true, saying: "If we fail to plan, then we plan to fail." Rejoicing Angels

Ever wonder what causes the angels in heaven to shout for joy? There are several instances of angels proclaiming joy, and they all seem to have a common thread.

The first instance of the heavenly host expressing joy is during the creation of the heavens and the earth. Recounting the incident, God tells Job that when it happened, "the morning stars sang together, and all the sons of God shouted for joy" (Job 38:1-7). Most Bible scholars agree that the morning stars and sons of God are in reference to angels, who apparently were created prior to the earth. So in this instance, we see the angels being joyous because of God using His creative powers to make something that had never existed before.

Let's look at another instance of the angels showing joy. When the proper time came (Gal. 4:4), God sent His Son to be born of the human race. It is at this time in announcing the birth of the Messiah to the shepherds that angels proclaimed it a time of "great joy" (Luke 2:8-14). So here the angels express praise and joy at the coming of the Christchild, the God-Man, Jesus. As in the creation, they are expressing joy over something that had never before existed.

There is one more instance I can find in the Bible of the angels expressing joy - and this one directly involves us. In Luke 15:10 we are told that "there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents." Seeing a sinner come to God and becoming a new creation brings great joy to the angels.

From these three instances, I think we can clearly see that angels get excited over new creations. Think about it: when we have our lives made new through baptism into Christ and we continue to live each day renewed in the Spirit, the angels rejoice over us. What an encouraging thought!

"And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, and they did not love their lives to the death. Therefore rejoice, O heavens, and you who dwell in them!" (Rev. 12:11-12a)

What do you think was the major problem with the church in ancient Corinth? Was it preacheritis and the denominational spirit that prevailed? Was it the lawsuits against each other in secular courts? Was it insensitivity toward Gentile converts who thought it was wrong to eat meat sacrificed to idols? Was it irreverence in worship? Was it the rich being inconsiderate of the poor regarding the Lord's supper? Was it the members who belittled each other over spiritual gifts?

The Corinthian church was in a mess, but these issues were only symptoms of the real problem. In fact, Paul seems to be more specific on what the Corinthian Christians were doing to each other in regarding spiritual gifts (1 Corinthians 13). It seems that some were acting impatient and unkind, jealous and boastful, arrogant and rude, selfish, irritable and resentful. Some seemed to have rejoiced in wrongdoing (ch. 5).

Do we not often find these symptoms in modern congregations too? What would you add? Do you think that these symptoms result in a worldly, less spiritually mature congregation where gossip, disrespect for others and irreverence reign? What is Paul's solution to it all?

Paul said that superior to the gifts of tongue-speaking and prophesying is the way of love. Not only would it outlast them both, it would even outlast faith and hope. Love is the only way that can bring the church to maturity and unity.

Do you want a good start to 2019? Be more patient and kind. Give benefit of the doubt to people. Hope for the best. Hold out for the good. If you see wrongdoing and falsehood, lovingly take a stand and seek to correct it, even when people say it is hateful. Don't be ashamed but rejoice with the truth. These things are what real love does.

Think about how much stronger our families and Christ's family at Hamburg Pike can be if we make the way of love our 2019 New Year resolution.
