## The Father's Testimony

One sabbath Jesus was walking among the sick and disabled at Bethzatha, a pool in Jerusalem surrounded by five covered colonnades. There he met a man who had been ill for 38 years. "Rise," Jesus said, "take up your pallet, and walk" (John 5:8). Instantly cured, the man rolled up his straw mat and walked away.

This healing ignited a firestorm. The tradition of the Jewish elders prohibited carrying a burden from one home to another on the sabbath. And inciting someone to violate sabbath tradition, as Jesus had done, was worse than violating it oneself.

As if breaking sabbath tradition were not bad enough, Jesus defended his actions in a way that could not have been more offensive to the Jewish authorities. He claimed that his actions on the sabbath were one with the Father's. If the Father could give life on the sabbath, then Jesus could restore health on the sabbath.

Jesus supported his claim to equality with God by calling witnesses. John the Baptist was his first. Temporarily, the Jews had rejoiced "in his light" (John 5:35). Jesus had something better than human testimony, though. His own miraculous works testified to his true identity (v. 36). But the Lord's most compelling and authoritative testimony came from his own Father. Jesus introduced three lines of incontrovertible evidence, none of which the Jews accepted.

First, Jesus appealed to the "voice" and "form" of God (John 5:37). At the Lord's baptism, the Spirit descended upon him like a dove and a voice from heaven proclaimed his unique Sonship. The Jewish authorities had neither witnessed this momentous event nor believed John's report concerning it.

Second, Jesus appealed to the "word" of God (John 5:38). The law and the prophets pointed unmistakably to the coming of Jesus of Nazareth. The Jews searched and memorized these scriptures, but they gave little heed to what God was saying. That went for his Son too.

Finally, Jesus appealed to his own presence among the Jews as the one "sent" of God (John 5:38). He himself was the ultimate revelation of the Father. One time Jesus told Philip that "he who has seen me has seen the Father" (14:9).

Isa. 5:1-7

I Am the True Vine (a.m.)

<sup>15</sup>The man went away and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had healed him. <sup>16</sup>And this was why the Jews were persecuting Jesus, because he was doing these things on the Sabbath. <sup>17</sup>But Jesus answered them, "My Father is working until now, and I am working." <sup>18</sup>This was why the Jews were seeking all the more to kill him, because not only was he breaking the Sabbath, but he was even calling God his own Father, making himself equal with God. <sup>19</sup>So Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of his own accord, but only what he sees the Father doing. For whatever the Father does, that the Son does likewise. <sup>20</sup>For the Father loves the Son and shows him all that he himself is doing. And greater works than these will he show him, so that you may marvel. <sup>21</sup>For as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, so also the Son gives life to whom he will. <sup>22</sup>The Father judges no one, but has given all judgment to the Son, <sup>23</sup>that all may honor the Son, just as they honor the Father. Whoever does not honor the Son does not honor the Father who sent him.
