Building Up Our Children: Repentance

This weekend is the seminar on God, the Government and the Christian by Stephen Morris of FHU. Although I do not know what subjects he will address, I would not be surprised if he includes America's dire need to repent. National repentance, of course, can only occur when each of its citizens repents. Repentance is the third of the Three R's that parents must teach their children. The natural question is, "what should they repent of?"

A search for the word "narcissism" on the internet will bring up many results that describe the youth of the country. Some psychologists say that the youth today are the most narcissistic generation in recent memory. They blame the change in culture. The self-esteem movement, for example, attempts to protect children from any form of negative feedback (poor grades, no score-keeping at ballgames, and no constructive criticism). This pampering, I think, has led to college "safe spaces" for protection from all offenses and to the censorship of free speech. Thus, many children grow up believing that they are special, entitled and that they can do no wrong and are not allowed to fail. No wonder mental illness and suicide rates are on the rise among Millennials and beyond. So sad.

In all fairness, every generation has had trouble with narcissism in its youth and memories tend to fade among the older ones. The WWII generation has been called the "Greatest Generation" because they answered the call of their country. However, I had someone from this generation tell me once that those of that generation doted on their Baby Boomer children after the war. For the longest time, the Boomers have been called the "Me" generation. This generation gave rise to participation trophies, no-fault divorces and latch-key Gen X-ers (my generation). No generation is guiltless of narcissism.

Narcissism is what the Bible calls "pride," and pride has been everyone's problem since Adam and Eve. Pride is simply rebellion against God. Pride causes us to disrespect Him and to refuse responsibility for our actions and mistakes. Even worse, pride prevents us from seeing the guilt of our sin and the need, therefore, of a savior. What do you expect when a generation is taught that truth and morality are relative?

Solomon says, "Pride goes before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall" (Proverbs 16:18). Indeed, Jesus told the Jews of His generation that, "unless you repent, you will all likewise perish" (Luke 13:3, 5). They did not repent; they perished in AD 70. Our nation needs to repent, to change its collective mind, and that begins with a humble submission to God. Christians should be at the front of the line as the Bible says, "Submit yourselves therefore to God" (James 4:7). Learning the first two R's, respect and responsibility, is a good place to start. We build up our children when we teach them to repent.
